## SYNOD ASSEMBLY RECAP

Pastor Robyn and Judy Bock attended the Southeast Michigan Synod Assembly for St. Luke's Lutheran Church. The assembly was held in Detroit at Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church on Friday, May 11 and Saturday, May 12. At this assembly we voted on elections for Synod Council and Churchwide Assembly representatives. We heard reports on the budget for the synod, from Rev. Dr. Albert Starr, a churchwide representative; Mr. Folabi Olagbaju from Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services; Pastor Paul Aebischer from Portico; Pastor Nik Schillack from Samaritas; Dean Kleinhans from Trinity Lutheran Seminary; Pastor Richard Wehrs from the Mission Investment Fund; Mr. CJ Clark from Living Water ministries; and Bishop Donald Kreiss. It was a wonderful, faith-filled event that continues to keep us connected with other churches in our synod and in the US.

Mr. Rusty Ward was elected from our conference to Synod Council. He sends along this greeting: "I was elected to a 3 year term to Synod Council from Conference 9 and I just wanted to send a brief introduction to St. Luke's. My name is Rusty Ward, and I am a member of Christ Lutheran in Monroe. It is also my intent to share information of interest to Conference 9 periodically. I am looking forward to my role as Synod Council member, and excited about the opportunities the future holds for us as a Synod and a Conference."

3 C. Sugar

2 qt. water

5 C. Pineapple Juice, chilled

1 C. Lemon Juice, chilled

1 qt. Ginger Ale or Sprite, chilled

3 pt. Lime Sherbet

Boil sugar with 1 quart water; cool. Add sugar mixture to remaining chilled juices.

Before serving, add ginger ale or Sprite. Float scoops of sherbet on top

## HIGH CHOLESTEROL

The fat in your blood is called cholesterol (Lipids). A waxy fatty substance (plaque) can become attached inside your blood vessels, making it difficult for blood to flow through your arteries, carrying our much needed oxygen. The result of high cholesterol can be heart attacks and strokes from the fat deposits that break away from the blood vessels and plug up the arteries.

There are two kinds of cholesterol, good and bad. The LDL (Low-density lipoprotein) is the bad kind, which can build up in the walls of the arteries. The arteries can get hard and narrow. The HDL (High-density Lipoprotein) is the good kind which helps get rid of the bad cholesterol.

High cholesterol causes are many, starting with heredity. Other causes are a high fat diet, obesity, lack of exercise, smoking, and diabetes. Blood tests can easily diagnose high cholesterol. It is recommended to have a Total Cholesterol under 200, the LDL under 100, and HDL above 60.

To prevent high cholesterol, limit animal fats such as red meat, and eat more fruits, vegetables, and grains for fiber. If overweight lose weight, stop smoking, exercise at least 30 minutes a day, and only drink alcohol in moderation.

There are many types of medications available for high cholesterol ordered by your Dr. Liver function blood tests are ordered during treatment, and side effects are possible. These medications have produced dramatic results lowering high cholesterol levels back to normal. Thanks be to God for modern medicine.

**Don't Leave your Pet in a hot vehicle!** Heatstroke can take a pet in minutes in a hot car. Leave your friend home on warm days if you're needing to run errands to places they can't come inside with you.

**Mind their Paws!** If you know the heat on your feet is bad, imagine how their paws might feel. If your furry friends are out, be sure to keep them off of hot asphalt, to avoid burns and increased body temperature.

**Provide the shade!** Water and shade are essential to keeping your pet cool and comfy in the summer heat. If they are outside for long periods, provide fresh water.

**Give them a trim.** Haircuts can go a long way to keeping your furry friends cooler in the summer. Thick fur can really raise their body temperature. Don't cut too short though— pets can get sunburned too!

**Keep your windowsills screened** to keep your cat from falling out of the window.

**Keep your pets away from fireworks.** Most of our fur-babies will run and hide under the bed on the 4th of July for fear of the loud booms, but when they are unlit, and your pet is out, be sure to keep them away from the fireworks. There are a lot of chemicals that are toxic.
